

## Occlusion of the bilio pancreatic limb post OAGB




### Clinical Image Description

A 29-year-old female presented with a severe acute epigastric pain that started two days ago and it was unbearable even with all over the counter pain killers. She underwent a laparoscopic cholecystectomy and one anastomosis gastric bypass (OAGB) for morbid obesity and gallbladder stones. The patient was stable without icterus. Clinical examination showed epigastric pain on palpation and blood tests were normal. CT Scan with intravenous contrast showed a dilated duodenum and biliary tract. The laparoscopic approach showed an occlusion of the bilio pancreatic limb through a bride between the left lobe of the liver and the remnant stomach. The patient benefits from a laparoscopic section of this one single adhesion and she was discharged on day 1.
